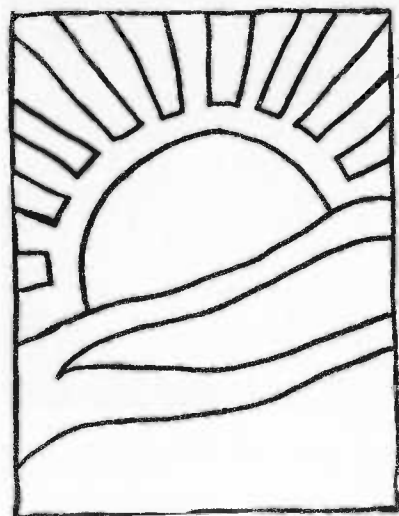

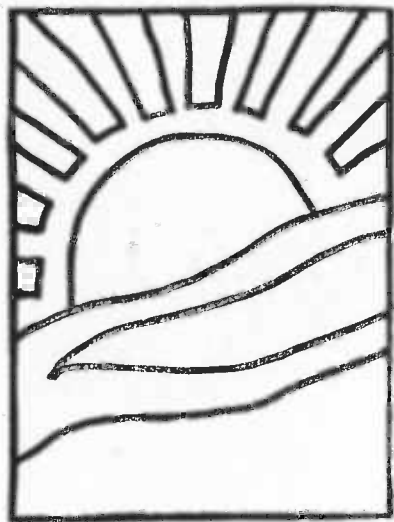
The development of the school and its students is reflected in the yearbook. May next year's yearbook be started early and continue to show our accomplishments and our pride in TAMUG.
