


LAUNCHING SHORENET

Here are some of the methods we used to build the EduBlogs (WordPress) overlay for the ShoreNet repository. The main page is <http://shoreneth.org>

When an administrator is logged into EduBlogs, this is what we see. Right now I'm looking at the Content Sidebar -- in the WordPress "Anjirai" theme, the Content Sidebar is the right-hand column where you can see our search box, Facebook feed, and Twitter feed.

To add one of these features, click on "Add A Widget" in the Customize area.



This will pop open a list of widgets for you to choose from. We'll use the "Text" one. (Notice also the "RSS Just Better" widget--we'll be coming back to that one, because it plays well with DSpace RSS feeds.)



For your RSS feed showing new repository entries: go to the bottom right corner of the repository, community, or collection page in DSpace and click on one of the RSS feed options. Copy that link and put it into the “Feed URL” area of an “RSS Just Better” widget. (We’re using an Atom feed.) We found that the plain RSS widget did not work well with our DSpace RSS feed, but RSS Just Better does. Customize the widget as you wish.

A sidebar widget might be too narrow for your map (or maybe it isn't!) We put our map in the main center area of the page. To put a map or other coded object in the center content section:

- Click on “Edit Page” at the top of your administrator screen

- Click “Add Media”

- Select “Insert Embed Code” from the sidebar on the resulting window.
