This required shooting through the glass, which diminished the quality of the photographs. There was also considerable difficulty in arranging for use of the aircraft. Adverse weather, and conflicts in scheduling accounted for numerous delays.




Figure I: Rollover Fish Pass October 20, 1958. Remedial construction is underway.




Figure II: Yarborough Cut August 8, 1959. Shifting dunes to the south have crossed the cut and the gulf entrance is closed.




Figure III: Gulf entrance of Mansfield Cut August 8, 1959.
