Check List of State of Texas statutes dealing with the Coastal Zone: Texas Revised Civil Statutes Annotated.

- §969a. Authorization for 99-year lease of islands or submerged lands by certain cities.
- §969a-1. Authorizes lease, sale, option or conveyance of islands, flats or other submerged lands.
- §1180a. Powers conferred on certain cities to improve streams or other bodies of water within their boundaries.
- §1187a. Cities authorized to construct bridges over and dykes and spillways along any body of navigable water.
- §1187a-1. Bonds for construction for International Bridge across Rio Grande.
- §1187a-2. Cities owning portion of international toll bridge over Rio Grande may issue bonds for construction and repairs.
- §1187b. Revenue bonds for operation by city of any tollway over or bridge under any inlet of the Gulf of Mexico.
- §1466. Authority for any person to build causeways over inlet of Gulf of Mexico for every type of inland transportation.
- §1467. Owner required to file report giving location of causeway within 90 days of commencement of construction.
- \$1468. Suit to file such statement shall be first in right to build.
- §1469. Individual has right of eminent domain to condemn approaches.
- §1470. Land under water is granted to claimant and 500 feet on each side for dredging.
- §1471. Owner of causeway may lease right of way to cities and corporations.
- §1472. Lessee of causeway may issue bonds to cover obligation to owner.
- §1473. Corporations have same right as individuals to construct causeway.
- §1592a. Gulfroad boundary lines of counties bordering on Gulf.
- §4026. All aquatic life in bodies of water within the state declared to be property of the state.

- §4027. Designation of natural oyster beds.
- §4035. Right of individual to obtain location for planting of oyster beds and making private oyster beds within public waters.
- §4036. Location of oyster bed to be examined to determine that it is not a natural oyster bed and then have it surveyed.
- §4037. Issuance of certificate to locator of oyster bed.
- §4038. Any person holding certificate as locator of oyster bed shall be protected from trespass.
- §4039. No person or corporation to own more than 100 acres of oyster bed.
- §4040. Locator of oyster to maintain survey markings of location.
- §4041. Locator will pay rent to state \$1.50/acre each year plus \$.02/barrel of sales.
- §4042. Anyone taking oysters from water for market must have state permit to do so.
- §4043. Unlawful to transport oysters, except from private beds between May and September.
- §4045. Unlawful to seine in closed waters.
- §4046. Application to seine for drum fish in area of oyster claims.
- §4047. Permit to use shrimp seine in tidal basins of the state.
- §4048. Use of scrapers or dredges on oyster beds restricted to American citizens on permit provided from state.
- §4049a. Authorization to construct salt water hatcheries on stateowned islands.
- §4050a. Consent of state to acquisition of state land for federal migratory bird reservation.
- §4054a. Authorization for coastal cities to take sand, gravel, and shell from any water to improve and repair seawalls.
- §4054b. Removal of sand of no commercial value from Corpus Christi bay to fill salt flats north of the city.
- §5248a. Easement granted to federal government for Inter-Coastal Waterway across Mud Bayou and East Bay Bayou.
- §5248b. Easement to federal government in Brazoria, Matagorda, Calhoun, and Aransas Counties for Inter-Coastal Waterway.

- §5248c. Land in Nueces Bay conveyed to federal government for military installation .
- §5382b. Geological and geophysical survey of areas within the tidewater limits.
- §5415a. Fixing of Gulfward boundary of state and declaration of sovereignty within that boundary.
- §5415b. Acceptance of land adjoining state acquired from Mexico by treaty with federal government in 1933.
- §5415c. Survey of coast line to determine low water contour.
- \$5415d. Public declared owners of beaches along coast line.
- §5415e. Conservation of state-owned submerged lands for public Free School Fund. Creation of Submerged Lands Advisory Committee.
- §5416. Land with public domain except that within the tidewater limits declared part of school fund.
- §5421C. Regulatory lease and sale of land within school fund excluding areas within tidewater limits.
- §5421C-3.Mineral estate in tidewater area set apart to benefit school fund.
- §5421C-4. Execution of surface lease and easements within tidewater area to federal government for national defense purposes.
- §5421C-5. Price of mineral lease for tidewater area within school fund to be set by School Land Board.
- §5421C-7. Tidewater area subject to mineral prospecting for rental payment of \$.10 per acre.
- §5421j. Land fill area of Corpus Christi Bay deeded to City of Corpus Christi.
- §5421j-1. City may lease land fill relinquished to it by state.
- §5421j-2. City of Corpus Christi authorized to lease submerged land upon whatever terms it wishes.
- §5421k. Submerged lands across Nueces Bay conveyed to Highway Commission for construction of causeway.
- §5517. Right of state and municipalities in any public lands shall not be banned by adverse possession.
- §6020a. Commissioner of General Land Office empowered to grant easement to public utility companies to cross tidewater area.

- §608lg. Cities of 60,000 or more population bordering on Gulf of Mexico granted use and occupancy for park purposes of tidelands and waters.
- §6317. Railroad allowed to construct right of way across public lands.
- §6329. Right to build right of way does not include construction that will obstruct navigable water.
- §6339. The right of way secured will not include the fee simple estate.
- §6674e. Money deposited in State Treasury for highway funds and federal aid for that project are subject to appropriation for that specific purpose.
- §6795b. Causeways, bridges, and tunnels authorized in Gulf Coast counties of 20,000 or more.
- §6795b-1. Causeways, bridges and tunnels authorized in Gulf Coast counties of 50,000 or more.
- §6797C. Removal of bridges obstructing intercoastal waterways.
- §6798. Every person owning the land fronting upon any water course navigable stream, lake or bay shall be entitled to keep a public ferry.
- §6812a. State Highway Department authorized to acquire ferries across navigable bodies of water and charge tolls for their operation.
- §6830. County commissioners of all counties on coast line may construct seawalls.
- §6831. Commissioners may use street and other public grounds for the location and erection of the seawalls.
- §6832. Commissioner may exercise eminent domain power for the acquisition of land for the seawalls.
- §6837. State cedes sea bottom below high tide to counties as needed for construction of seawall.
- §7962. Reclamation of overflowed land by levee improvement district.
- §8225. Navigation District Commissioners are empowered to acquire property for all necessary improvements.
- §8247B. Navigation district may construct harbors, turning basins and other projects for navigation purposes.

- §8248. Pilot Board for Navigation District.
- §8249. Navigation Districts have exclusive jurisdiction over pilotage of boats.
- §8263e. Creating self-liquidating Navigation Districts.

- Art. 698b. Pollution of public bodies of surface water prohibited.
- Art. 934a. Commercial fishermen and oystermen required to secure licenses from State Game and Fish Commission.
- Art. 941. Unlawful to use seine or net without permit.
