About the GALVESTON PARK BOARD

he Galveston Park Board of Trustees is a nonprofit government entity created by the Texas Legislature in 1962 for the purpose of directing all of Galveston's tourism efforts. The Park Board oversees several island beach parks and the Galveston Island Beach Patrol. The Park Board also oversees the Galveston Island Convention & Visitors Bureau whose mission is to promote Galveston as a premier beach destination. The organization is funded solely by Hotel Occupancy Tax revenue and beach-user fees and receives no property or sales tax.

How Tourism Supports GALVESTON'S GROWTH

Tourism is a dynamic and productive part of the economy, providing small businesses employment opportunities in a range of services and amenities. The Galveston Island Convention & Visitors Bureau (CVB) spends more than \$3 million annually on marketing and sales efforts to promote Galveston, generating an 8-1 return on investment. The Park Board supports the quality and safety of the island by investing more than 32,000 hours into beach maintenance at the island's beach parks each year. In addition, the Galveston Island Beach Patrol performed more than 50,000 preventative safety actions last year alone.

Beach Park FACILITIES

Park Board facilities offer a hassle free day at the beach by providing showers, restrooms and food and beverage concessionaires along with trash and seaweed maintenance. Admission to each park is \$8 per vehicle.

Galveston Park Board of Trustees COASTAL ZONE MAINTENANCE POLICY

Emergency debris control services along all 32 miles of Galveston beaches are provided by the Park Board Coastal Zone Maintenance Crew. Residents can contact the Park Board for service. Seaweed and trash removal service is provided along the Seawall Urban Park (between 10th and 103rd streets) and at Park Board facilities, including; R.A. Apffel Park, Stewart Beach, Dellanera RV Park and the three West End County Pocket Parks.

Trash and litter removal is provided by the Park Board at West End beach access points. Visit www.galvestonparkboard.com for a complete list of Park Board serviced access points.

Frequently Asked QUESTIONS

WHAT IS SEAWEED?

Seaweed, also known as gulfweed or sargassum, is a free-floating algae found in warm coastal waters. Seaweed provides crucial habitat for a wide variety of marine animals in the open occar, as well as onshore for animals like sea turtles and marine birds.

WHEN IS SEAWEED SEASON?

Scaweed season on the Gulf Coast fluctuates as Mother Nature sees fit. However, seaweed typically washes up on Galveston's beaches May through July

WHY DOES THE PARK BOARD NOT REMOVE SEAWEED?

Seaweed has many environmental benefits including helping to retain and on Galveston beaches and providing an environment for natural dunc formations. Park Board crews push seawood away from the shoreline to provide easy access to the Gulf for heach goers.

WHEN ARE PARK BOARD SCAWEED MAINTENANCE CREWS ON THE BEACH?


Seawted maintenance crews operate as needed depending on seaweed levels, which can be daily during peak season. For safety reasons, the crews operate at low-traffic unies for the beach parks, typically after 9 p in through the early morning

IF I REPRESENT A HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION OR RESIDENCE CAN I CLEAN MY OWN BEACH?

Homeowner's associations or residences may contract with private companies for seaweed maintenance needs after obtaining proper permits from the City of Galveston.
