Bicycling

Exploring on your bicycle is the preferred way to get around and see Mackinac Island. Bring your own or rent bikes on the Island and ride the eight mile perimeter route along M-185. It's the easiest, most popular ride and a good way to aquaint yourself with the Island's beauty. The ride around the Island is mostly flat, very scenic, and takes about an hour without stopping. But what's the rush? You'll want to go slow, take photos and enjoy the beauty, so allow at least 2 hours.

INSIDE TIP: For a little more challenging ride, there are numerous trails in the Island's interior offering a variety of rolling paved roads and bike paths, beautiful wooded trails and for advanced cyclists, steep rocky routes for expert riders on mountain bikes only. Mackinac offers biking for cyclists of all levels of abilities.

REMEMBER: Always use caution, stay to the right side of the road or trail and remember horses and pedestrians have right of way.





Mackinac Island has been a hub of commerce and trading for centuries. After the war of 1812, fur trappers came to the Island to trade their animal pelts for food and provisions. As the fur business faded in the 1870s, tourism grew to become Mackinac's primary industry. Island residents adapted to the changing business economy from furs to tourism. Native Americans and Islander entrepreneurs began selling souvenirs to visitors. Woven sweet grass baskets, carved trinkets, pottery and birch bark novelties were typical items sold to Island visitors to remember their visit to Mackinac. These were the first souvenirs sold on Mackinac.

Ever since, visitors to the Island have wanted souvenirs of their own to take home. Buying a keepsake item, a memento or reminder of Mackinac is a wonderful idea, but the merchandise has changed guite a bit since those early years.
