**Preparing and Filling Test Tubes** 

- 1. Grab 5 racks of tubes from the bookshelf. Make sure that each rack is a complete set.
  - a. Make sure all the tubes in a rack have the same reef code and the will be numbered 1-10 and then 16-25. This is a complete set
  - b. Please see picture
- 2. TPWD will use 6 racks with tubes from the cardboard box.
  - i. The reef codes for these tubes will be SL1, GB2, GB3, GB4, MB1, MB2, MB3, LB2, LB3, SA1, SA2, and SA3. see picture
  - ii. Please contact Jan Culberston (jan.culbertson@tpwd.state.tx.us) for the correct numbering system as it changes every month.
- 3. Transfer test tubes to black 6 X 12 tube racks.
  - a. 3 regular racks to one black rack and 2 to the other.
  - b. 3 and 3 for TPWD
- 4. Get one of the fancy pipetters out of the white box on top of the refrigerator. Squirt the DI water inside of it into the sink.
  - a. Make sure the pipetter is set to 10 mL then place the end of the pipetter tube into the medium.
  - b. Pump the pipetter over the beaker a few times to get out all the air.
- 5. Place the tip of the pipetter into one of the test tubes at a slight angle and pump in 10 mL of medium.
  - a. Let the pipetter completely refill with medium before moving to the next test tube because the pipetters drips.
- 6. Repeat for remaining test tubes.
- 7. If there is extra medium grab an extra test tube from the yellow 6 X 12 rack on the bookshelf and pump 10mL into that tube. Place into one of the empty spaces on a black rack.
- 8. Grab one of the baskets of plain black caps by the sink.
  - a. Use the numbered caps for the extra tubes
  - b. Grab the caps out of the cardboard box for TPWD tubes
- 9. Twist on the caps, **BUT** only enough so as the threads catch.
  - a. If you twist on all the way the test tubes could explode while in the pressure cooker.
