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Introduction

The Gulf Agency, Inc. Collection was donated to the Williams Library at Texas A&M University at Galveston by the Moore Memorial Library of Texas City, TX. Photocopying is permitted for purposes of preservation and scholarly research at the discretion of the archivist. Processing of the collection was completed in March 2005. The collection is approximately 1 lin. ft., housed in three boxes. Much of the collection suffers from the acidic nature of the paper used during the war years. Preservation techniques such as photocopying onto acid-free paper, use of mylar, and digitizing have been employed in order to allow access to the collection.

Scope and Contents

The collection consists of the business records of the Gulf Agency, Inc. (steamship agents) of Texas City, TX dating 1939 to 1946. The collection includes numerous correspondence with other steamship agents, shipping companies and agencies of the federal government. Correspondents include: Boy-Campbell Company, Corpus Christi, TX; C.D. Mallory & Co., New York City; Collin & Gissel, Houston, TX; Marine Transport Lines, New York City; Seatrain Lines, Houston, TX, New Orleans, LA, NYC, and New Jersey; States Marine Corporation, Houston, TX; Texas Transport and Terminal Co., Galveston, TX; W.H. Richardson, Port Arthur, TX and numerous letters with directives from the U.S. Coast Guard (Galveston, TX); US Maritime Commission (Galveston, TX & New Orleans, LA), Custom Service (Galveston, TX), War Shipping Administration (New Orleans, LA) and the War Shipping Administration/Maintenance & Repair Division (Galveston, TX and New Orleans, LA).

Included as attachments in the correspondence from the federal government are various bulletins and directives regarding merchant marine vessels. The correspondence documents the scheduling of ships, their cargo which included balsa wood, twine, rice, flour, petroleum products and bonded seastores *i.e.* cigarettes, and a brief history of the Seatrain Lines in correspondence with US Customs.

Among the documents are various instructions, directives and forms relating to the maintenance of vessels in the merchant marine fleet. Of interest are the pricelists from local vendors who supplied laundry service to the ships and food supplies. Setting the tone of the collection is a newspaper clipping from 1940 which records the order of Secretary of the Treasury, Henry Morgenthau, Jr. prohibiting any ship from leaving a United States port on a foreign voyage without his authorization and a proclamation by President Franklin D. Roosevelt establishing a new office of merchant ship movement.

SERIES DESCRIPTIONS

Series 1: Correspondence .66 lin.ft. Dates: 1939-1949 Box 1-2

Arranged in three subseries: incoming, outgoing and other. Within the subseries, arranged alphabetically, then by date. Correspondence is primarily with other shipping agents, shipping companies and with various US government agencies with shipping interests during World War II. Subjects included in the correspondence from various government agencies are: screening of crew's quarters RE: malaria; warshiprep contracts; damaged government owned installations; reduction of port time for merchant vessels; arming of merchant vessels; Victory ship armed guard for officer's quarters; torpedo defense nets; and vessel conversions and repairs.

Bulletins from the War Shipping Administration are found as enclosures in related correspondence. Gulf Agency's outgoing correspondence are *cc* of the original letters. Correspondence copied (*cc*) to Gulf Agency, or included as enclosures, are filed with the related correspondence.

**Series 2: Documents .25 lin.ft. Dates: 1939-1946, 1951
Box 2, 3**

Arranged in four subseries: legal documents, regulations, financial documents, and forms. Legal documents include a Power of Attorney for the Gulf Agency, Inc., a contract with the Galveston-Texas City Pilots and Marine Transport Lines, Inc. and certificates and regulations primarily issued by the federal government regarding merchant marine ships and shipping during World War II. Financial documents include receipts, vouchers and invoices related to Gulf Agency's business. The regulations are primarily from the War Shipping Administration and U.S. Coast Guard, particularly regarding PD-3A and life boats. Of particular note is the "List of Documents required by U.S. Customs. The fourth subseries includes customs forms and purchase order forms for marine supplies.

Arranged in three subseries: price lists, brochures, and newspaper clippings.

Within the subseries, arranged alphabetically, then by date. The price lists document cost of laundry for the ships and food supplies. *See also* correspondence with Sunshine Laundry. Also included is a “Weekly List of Selected US Government Publications” by the Superintendent of Documents, and a newspaper clipping: “All ships affected by orders” FDR – 1940.
